General Notes:

We have 8 clowns willing to serve men and/or women Walks:
Clay, Coco D Klutz, Gracie, Hawkshaw the hobo, Hazel, Lenny, New Heart & Oochee..
Clown will provide only the bread (contains gluten). **Juice to be provided by the sacristan.**
Gluten-free elements (bread or wafer) are to be provided by the sacristan.
We appreciate being prayed for BEFORE & AFTER serving.

We will need others to operate sound system or CD player for our music and to serve the elements, so we are able to hand out nails to participants (for those of us who do) after they have received Communion elements.

Most clowns are available to serve on Journey With Christ weekends, church services, small groups or other occasions as well.

 Clay: Dave Potter (360) 633-5419 tiggerakadave@gmail.com Lacrosse, WA	 Clay is a military man in the church who is reminded by Jesus and reminds other believers of our calling: that we need to get back into the battle for the Lord, based on the Great Commission: <i>Go and make disciples of all nations, teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.</i> The background music is a mix of songs meant to bring those in the service into a deeper understanding of the 3 seasons of Jesus' ministry: birth, crucifixion, and resurrection; one without the other is useless.	Although Clay tends to look like the first picture, Dave wants you to know that he will work with those who might want a softer look like Clay is shown in the second picture. He prefers both services on same day but is willing to discuss different days. May be unable to work an entire Walk weekend. But he says to contact him, and he will pray about the request.

As she explores and interacts with all around her, she discovers a brightly colored gift From God. When she excitedly thinks it's for her, God lets her know it's not just for her but for everyone. As she unpackages, decorates the altar, and enters into the story of taking God's gift of Communion from cradle to the cross, she resists doing what God tells her to. After telling God there must be another way, He gently lets her know this is the only way and CoCo reluctantly follows God's plan. (I usually like to help give out HIS body broken for you here - but I am very willing to work with the preferences of directors and clergy team in this). After all, receive Communion, CoCo goes back to the altar reflecting on all that has happened and "sleeps" on it. She wakes up to find the gift keeps on giving - He is risen! Joyfully she hugs God's gift and goes leaping and dancing out...changed!	I need 8 to 10 weeks' notice, as I work 2 jobs during the school year and am booked several weeks in advance, usually. Not available the 3rd Friday of each month. It would also be easier and more cost effective to have both the pilgrims and background Communion services on the same day.
 gideon: Gary Bush (509) 539-8905 gideon.ih@gmail.com Richland, WA	gideon is a simple-minded, child-like, hobo clown who wanders into a room or sanctuary and is amazed by everything he sees and experiences. Although he's a bit shy, he discovers that he seems to be in a safe place. gideon shares his discovery of Who Jesus is and develops a relationship with Him that he shares with those in the service through His birth, crucifixion, and resurrection. The soft background music, based on Old Testament Scripture, is intended to help create intimate moments with the Lord so everyone can experience God's embracing love, reflect on His holiness, and His desire to be with us. This "telling" of His Story, without using any spoken words, moves from laughter to tears of grief to tears of triumphant joy. From the time gideon enters to the time he leaves, including serving of the Communion elements, this service runs about 30 minutes.	RETIRED Although gideon no longer presents God's message as part of a Communion service, Gary still supports and encourages those in the clown community and those who participate in the clown workshops.

Gracie is an Auguste clown with a vibrant costume of red, black, and white. As she begins her presentation, a child-like enthusiasm is felt immediately by her audience. Gracie begins her presentation lost, trying to find her way through life using the world's way of finding direction. Quickly she becomes frustrated and decides to go it alone. Soon, she notices two bags on the stage, one black and one red. Something (God) is urging her to choose the red bag, but after observing the outside of each bag she decides the black bag is the most suitable for her. Throughout her journey, she learns the black bag signifies sin and death and the red bag is a "Gift from God." Gracie quickly learns that the items the world (the black bag) offers have no lasting value. Eventually, Gracie surrenders to God and is prompted to open the red bag, revealing the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Gracie listens as God tells her what she must do and, although she doesn't understand and becomes afraid, she ultimately trusts and follows God's direction. As she begins to grasp the fullness of God's gift of grace, she can hardly contain her joy. She departs the presentation in celebration of the light of the world.

Gracie's music is cued to the presentation using a variety of songs to set each scene.

Her presentation runs 20-35 minutes depending on number of people.

She has all her own props and is available to present according to the schedule the director(a) prepares.

She will work Men's and Women's Walks and Journeys.

She is willing to travel to any Walk location.

Gracie is willing to present for the Inn and Background. She is willing to present on the same day or on two separate days (Friday and Saturday).

This is a story of God's redeeming love, using the symbolism of bread, as the Christ child. Going from the birth to the crucifixion to the resurrection, God shows Lenny His unending love. The presentation is presented with mostly instrumental music, with some words.	Currently, Lenny is available to work men's and/or women's Walks. Lenny does not need to work the Inn only. Lenny is willing to work background only, if no one is available. If men's Walk, and Lenny is presenting both services, and distance is far, it is preferable to do both services on the same day but not required. Lenny can supply bread and juice if arrangements are made. However, gluten-free must be provided by the organization.
 New Heart: Dean Logsdon (509) 994-2224 deananddeedee@yahoo.com Spokane, WA	New Heart is a white face, very classy clown in a blue tuxedo jacket with tails. He enters the sanctuary as a cleaner and sets up his props as part of the presentation. He discovers a mysterious box and through his exploration of the box, finds a baby. He is shown that the baby is God's Son and that His Son is destined to be crucified for our sins. New Heart argues with God and tries his best to save the baby from God's plan, but in the end must follow the will of God. The tables are turned when God wants to show New Heart that His Son has been resurrected, but New Heart argues that He is dead and there is no point in disturbing the dead. Once again, New Heart loses the argument and follows God's directions to look into the tomb – the empty tomb – and shares what he finds inside the tomb. The music is soft background music. There are two tracks to be played, and the first track is long enough for the first part of the presentation including serving of Communion. The second track is played after Communion and will have about four minutes of soft background music left to allow for reflective time after New Heart exits. For scheduling purposes, you should plan on the presentation taking approximately 35 to 40 minutes, including opening/entry songs, Communion, and some reflective time at the end. Not including those items listed above, the actual presentation is about 20 to 25 minutes long.	1. He's very happy to present on different days, twice during the weekend (i.e. K/P on Fri. and Inn on Sat.) if that is what is best for each team's schedule. The presentation should work within the teams' schedules, rather than dictate when the presentation should be. This applies to both Men's and Women's walks. 2. If his work schedule does not allow him to work the full weekend (for Men's walks), he may still be available to present Communion on Friday night and/or Saturday. Please call or e-mail to verify availability for either Men's or Women's walks. 3. He requires a lectern (usually there's one in the church), otherwise self-contained.
 Oochee: Maureen Mould (509) 406-5452 maureen@maureenmould.com Salem, OR	Oochee, the Clown's character, is a whimsical little girl clown who is spirited and joyful but initially totally unaware of who God and Jesus are. The clown's play is interrupted as God gets her attention to open up a big box from God which she thinks is a present only for her. The carefully selected background music poignantly portrays the life of Christ. The clown innocently and playfully takes items out of the box as the audience is moved from laughter to tears and back to laughter. The clown engages and challenges the audience during this mime. In the end they are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus. The clown displays a wide range of emotions and vulnerability which makes this a very moving unforgettable vignette. It is filled with light-hearted innocence and life-changing realizations of the transforming love of God for us all.
